JOIN YOUNG PROFESSIONALS IN THE WATER QUALITY INDUSTRY

The Town of Amherst, Massachusetts water resource recovery facility (WRRF) serves the Town as well as Amherst College, Hampshire College, and the University

of Massachusetts Amherst (UMASS). The facility was originally constructed in 1980 as a conventional activated sludge treatment system including primary clarifiers, aeration basins fitted with mechanical surface aeration, secondary clarifiers, and disinfection with sodium hypochlorite. In 2008, a water reuse treatment system that includes reverse osmosis treatment and supplemental disinfection was added to the facility for treating a portion of the effluent flow. There is also a pilot testing and research facility called the Water and Energy Technology Testing Center (WET Center) located immediately adjacent to the WRRF where researchers from UMASS are working on innovative treatment and recovery technologies using pilot-scale systems.
